Praise

Call to Worship (*everyone together*)

Awake, my glory! Awake, O harp and lyre! I will awake the dawn! I will give thanks to You, O Lord, among the peoples; I will sing praises to You among the nations. For Your steadfast love is great to the heavens, Your faithfulness to the clouds. Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Let Your glory be over all the earth!

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Acts 14.27-15.21 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion: (*may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times*)

1. What was the problem that the church was addressing in Acts 15? Why was it hard to resolve?
2. What are the names of the people involved? Who were they?
3. How does Peter say that we are all saved in verse 11? What is the “grace of the Lord Jesus”?
4. How does James say that the Jewish Christians should treat the Gentiles in verse 19?
5. How does James say that the Gentile Christians should treat the Jewish Christians in verses 20-21? Why does he put these things on the list?
6. How do we make it hard for people to turn to God today? How can we do a better job of helping people turn to Him and love Him?

Scripture Memory for April (*memorize this passage of Scripture this month*)

Acts 14.21-22

When they had preached the gospel to that city and had made many disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God.
